

Meeting of the Parish Council on Monday
 March 11th 1895 at 7.30. P.M. in the
 National Schools. Chapeleuleyorth.

Present - Colonel Hall (presiding) Messrs Bramwell,
 Attendance Keyworth, Spencer, Lomas (B) Lomas (T)
 Morten, and Marchington.

Letters were read from Messrs Heywood & Reynolds stating their inability to attend

Minutes The minutes were read and confirmed
 Then signed by the chairman.

The next business was the Report of Committee as to
 Report of Place of Meeting.

Mr Bramwell as representing the Committee said that

Re Place of Meeting Steps were being taken to seek out a suitable place
 and if the Council would leave the matter over until
 the next meeting, the Committee might then have
 something definite to bring before them.
 It was therefore decided to adjourn the question
 until the next meeting).

The Report of Standing Orders Committee was next
 Report of received.

Standing Orders Mr Bramwell stated that Copies of the Standing
 Committee Orders (as submitted to the last meeting of the Council)
 had been struck off, and with one or two slight
 alterations (which were named) the Committee
 recommended their adoption.

On the motion of Mr Bramwell, seconded by
 Adoption of Mr Morten, the Standing Orders as recommended by
 Standing Orders the Committee were adopted unanimously

The Report of Committee as to Division of Parish into
Division Wards, was next in order on the Agenda
into Ward.

Mr Keyworth said that the matter was practically where
it was at the last meeting of the Council

It was therefore adjourned until the next meeting

The Report of Committee (Re Parochial Charities) was the
Parochial next-business

Charities Col Hall informed the Council that the Committee
had met prior to the meeting of the Council, but as
nothing had been done, only the fixing of the date
and time for the next meeting, the matter would have
to be adjourned.

Mr Brannell proposed Mr Marchington seconded -
Appointment That a special meeting of the Council be held on
of Monday March 25-1895. To consider the appointment
Surveyors of Highways

carried unanimously

The question of the necessity or otherwise, of calling an annual
Meeting of Ratepayers for the 25th March, was next
considered. The Council suggested that the Clerk should
write to Mr Wallis Davies (Secretary of Parish Council Association)
and ask him whether the Council would have to call
a Ratepayers Meeting or not, as there was practically
no business to lay before them

The question of the Bond of the Treasurer was next considered

Treasurers Bond

Mr Bramwell assured the Council that he esteemed it an honour to be elected their Treasurer, but at the same time he could not see his way to pay the necessary premium himself. As the office was not a remunerative one he did not think it right that anyone who was called to act in

that capacity should lose by it

Premium to be paid out of the Rates

Mr Lomas (3) Proposed Mr Keyworth seconded
That the Premium for Treasurers Bond, be paid out of the Funds of the Council

Carried unanimously

Bond of the Assistant Overseer

Mr Bramwell proposed Mr Marchington seconded
That the Bond of the Assistant Overseer be fixed at the sum of £100

carried unanimously

Call ~~of~~

The Council decided that a call be made on the Overseers for the sum of £25 to be paid on the 18th March 1895

Notice of Motion

Mr Bramwell then gave notice,


That at the next meeting of the Council he should move, That the Council meet on the 2nd Monday in each month for the Ordinary Meetings

The necessary forms to begin -
That the Clerk be empowered to get the necessary forms required for the Business of the Council
