Whereas by section 46 (1) (e) of the Local
Government Act 1894 it is provided that a Person
shall be disqualifyed from being Elected or being a
Member, or Chairman of a Council of a Parish if he
is concerned in any bargain or contract entered into
with the Council, or participates in the profit of any such
bargain or contract, or of any work done under the authority
of the Council

and Whereas by Section 46 (3) of the said act it is provided
that where a person who is a Parish Councillor is concerned
in any such bargain or contract or participates in any
such profits as would disqualify him for being a Parish
Councillor the disqualification may be removed by the
County Council if they are of opinion that such
removal would be beneficial to the Parish.

And Whereas Mr Samuel James Bramwell, Printer
 and Stationer has been duly Elected a Parish Councillor
 for the Parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith in the County of Derby.
 And Whereas the Derbyshire County Council are of opinion
 that it will be beneficial to the Parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith
 that the Said Samuel James Bramwell may be
 allowed to bargain and contract with the Parish
 Council of the Said Parish for work and material
 in the ordinary course of his business
 Now it is hereby ordered that the disqualification
 imposed by section 46 (7) of the Local Government
 act 1894, shall in the case of the said Samuel
 James Bramwell be removed and that he
 shall be at liberty to contract and bargain
 with the Parish Council for the Parish of
 Chapel-en-le-Frith as a Printer and Stationer
 in the ordinary course of his business without
 incurring such disqualification as aforesaid

The Report of the Charities Committee was next submitted it read as follows -

The Charities Committee has had under its consideration the whole of the Charities relating to Chapel-en-le-Frith Parish and submits the following Recommendations to the Council viz - With respect to the three Educational Charities Dixons, Kirks, and Marchingtons, which bring in at present a total income of £27. 9.8 per annum and of which the Vicar and Churchwardens are Trustees, the Committee recommend that Mr Ebenezer Hyde Market Place Chapel-en-le-Frith, and Mr James Thompson of Town End, Chapel-en-le-Frith be appointed Trustees in place of Churchwardens.

With respect to the following 11 Charities viz -
Walkers. Bowdens. Bradshaws. Dains. Vernous. Mosley.
Geers. Gaskell. J. Barbers. Radcliffe's. Needhams.
 which bring in a total income of £27. 19.0 per annum and of which the Churchwardens and Overseers have hitherto acted as Trustees, The Committee recommend that Mr Joseph Heathcott of Chapel-en-le-Frith, Mr F. J. J. Reynolds of Chapel-en-le-Frith, Mr George Lomas of Tunstead Farm, and Mr G. W. Keyworth of Dove Holes be appointed Trustees in place of Churchwardens and Overseers.

With respect to the following 2 Charities viz
 Hibberts and Kirk's. Total income £5-15-0 which
 is applied to an apprentice Fund, the Churchwardens
 and Overseers acting as Trustees. The Committee
 recommend the same Trustees as for the preceding
 11 Charities.

With respect to Gratts Charity, representing a total
 sum of £125 of which no trace can now be found,
 but which appears (according to a Report of the
 Charity Commissioners) to have been in existence
 in 1835, The Committee recommend that the
 Charity Commissioners be asked what steps it
 is possible to take towards the recovery of the
 Charity.

With respect to the remaining Charities viz -
Mosleys. W Barbers. Woods. Marshalls. Schools.
Gisbornes. Parish Land. Bowden Head School.

(Some of which are Ecclesiastical) sufficient
 information has not yet been obtained, to enable
 the Committee to make any recommendation.

inhabitants of this Parish
