

Meeting of the Parish Council in
the Council Office on Monday Aug 26
1894 at 7.30 p.m.

Present - Mr Joseph Heathcote (presiding)
Attendance Messrs Reynolds, Bramwell, Lomas (S), Lomas (B),
Martin, Keyworth, & The Clerk.

Minutes The Minutes of the preceding were read, and
Confirmed.

Then signed by the Chairman

Letters from Mr Ebenezer Hyde and
Mr James Thomason, expressing their thanks for
the honour conferred upon them at the last
Meeting of the Council by Electing them Trustees of
the Educational Charities, viz Disons, Kicks, and
Marchingtons.

Reply from Local
Government Board A Letter from the Local Government Board was read,
referring to the question of the Parish Council as to
whether the Council could furnish Offices without
the Consent of a Parish Meeting.

The Local Government Board's Reply was favourable
to the Council, whereupon

Resolution Mr Keyworth proposed Mr Martin seconded
that the General Purposes Committee be
empowered to rent from the Savings Bank Trustees
for the Parish Council, on the most reasonable
Terms possible, the Two Rooms available
in the Town Hall, and to purchase the
requisite Furnishings
carried unanimously

The Reports of Committees were next received
Mr Morten reported that the Wards Committee
had met; and had instructed the Clerk to procure
Report of
Committee a Map of the Parish and mark thereon the
Divisions of the proposed Wards, also to obtain
the Rateable Value, The Acreage, and Population
of each proposed Ward and submit the same
to the County Council

Mr Heathcote as Chairman of the Allotments Committee
stated that an interview was arranged with a deputation
Report of Com^{tee}
(Allotments) from the Requisitionists, which took place in due course
It was then learned that the applicants desired to
obtain land situated above or below the Midland
Station, to the extent of about half a rood each, for
which they would be willing to pay at the rate of
7/6 to 10/- per half rood.

Subsequently the views of the several owners concerned
were ascertained, and it appears that there is
not any likelihood of the desired land being obtained
at such a price as would meet the wishes of the
applicants.

The Committee were making further inquiries with
the object of ascertaining what other land might
be available for the required purpose, and when
that information was gathered it was proposed
to again meet the requisitionists, and also to present
a further report to a later meeting of the Council

The Assistant Overseer submitted the names of Mr John Jackson and Mr Edward Ford as his bondsmen subject to the approval of the Parish Council.

Acceptance Mr Brannwell proposed Mr Lomas (J) seconded of the Assistant Overseers that the Parish Council accept the persons of Edward Ford and John Jackson (as sureties for the good conduct of the Assistant Overseer) jointly on the sum of £100 carried unanimously.

Notice of Motion Mr Brannwell then gave notice that at the next meeting he should move the appointment of a Finance Committee composed of the Chairman & Vice Chairman.

Accounts On the motion of Mr Reynolds seconded by Mr Morten it was Resolved that the account of Mr S J Brannwell Painter & Stationer for the sum of £ 4 - 0 - 11 be passed

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
